OUR NEW CHAPLAIN (news at last!)

We are now able to share with everyone the name of our new Chaplain, although with the caveat that it is still subject to obtaining a Visa from the Spanish authorities!

His name is Rev. Dr. Tony Carroll and together with his wife Gisela they are looking forward to joining us. There is a picture and a short introduction from Tony below and a link to a video that he has recorded for us.

His actual start date is still dependant on getting the appropriate Visa and post-Brexit this is a lot more complicated than it was before as well as a lot more expensive. We have needed to engage a specialist visa/immigration law firm to navigate the process and help with the paperwork of which there is a great deal, much of which needs to be officially translated into Spanish and notarised. In addition, we now believe that we will need to provide private medical insurance for the first year in order to get any visa approved.

We hope that the visa application can be submitted shortly but after that the consulate then has three months to respond. This puts the expected start date of December at risk, and we are making provision for an Easter start date if this proves necessary. However, we are hoping that Tony and Gisela can come over for about 3 weeks over Christmas & New Year to spend with us and get to know us. More details will be shared as they become available.

Reverend Dr. Tony Carroll

I was born in Liverpool in 1965 and after taking a science degree in Sheffield, and a year in church work in inner city Liverpool, I joined a Roman Catholic religious order, the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1987. Pre-ordination training in the Jesuits gave me opportunities to serve in parishes, to work with a variety of marginalized groups in different countries, including 2 years in Bilbao with Proyecto Hombre, to study philosophy and theology in the UK and France, and to grow in my appreciation of the central place that prayer and liturgy play in the Christian life. I was ordained a Roman Catholic priest in 1999 and then sent to do doctoral studies at the University of Frankfurt in Germany, during which time, I also served as a chaplain in the international English-speaking parish in Frankfurt. Following completion of my PhD, I returned to the UK to teach philosophy and theology at Heythrop College, the University of London from 2004-2018 alongside serving as an assistant priest at various parishes in South London and working as a sessional chaplain at Holloway women's prison in North London.



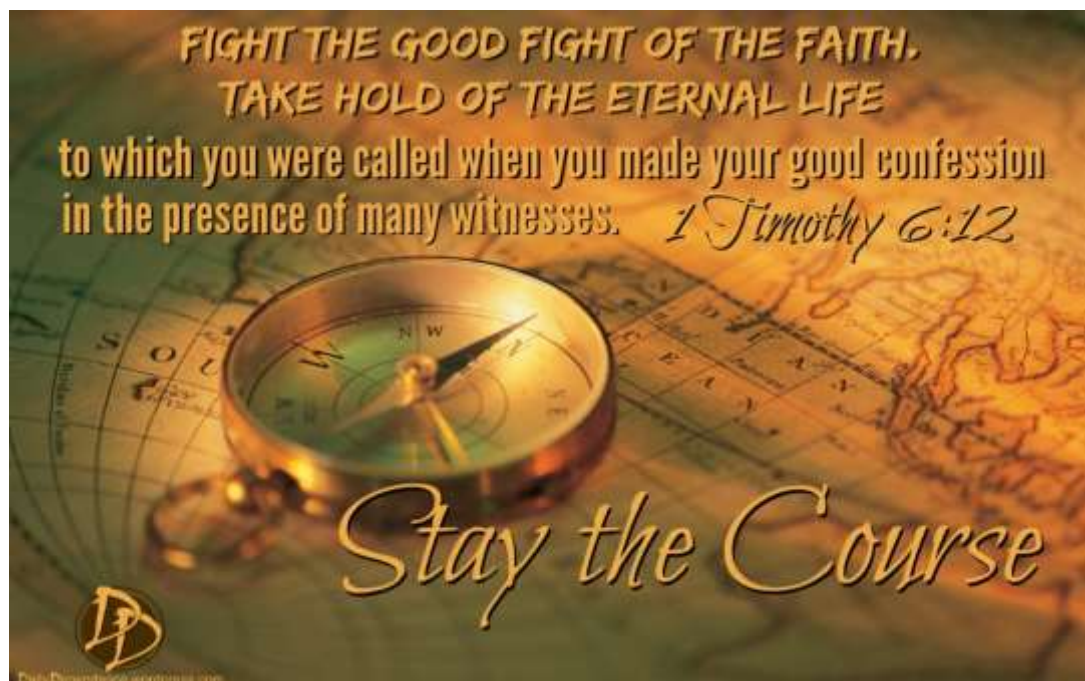
I was ordained a Roman Catholic priest in 1999 and then sent to do doctoral studies at the University of Frankfurt in Germany, during which time, I also served as a chaplain in the international English-speaking parish in Frankfurt. Following completion of my PhD, I returned to the UK to teach philosophy and theology at Heythrop College, the University of London from 2004-2018 alongside serving as an assistant priest at various parishes in South London and working as a sessional chaplain at Holloway women's prison in North London.

I joined the Church of England in 2013, whilst working at Heythrop and served my curacy at the parish of St Mary and St Eanswythe with St Saviour in Folkestone, where I was married in 2015. Following the closure of Heythrop in 2018, I took up a new position teaching theology and organizing social and pastoral and placements for students at the College of the Resurrection in Mirfield, which trains women and men for ordained ministry.

I am delighted to have been chosen to serve you as the next chaplain of the Costa del Sol West and my wife Gisela, who is currently working as a counsellor in Saltaire, and I are very much looking forward to getting to know you and sharing in the life of the chaplaincy. Please keep us in your prayers as we prepare for our move to the chaplaincy and be assured of our prayers for you.

Born in Scotland but now resident in Ireland, **Sylvia Burnside** (Mezzo-Soprano) is equally at home singing classical arias and jazz standards. As a soloist with New Irish Arts, she has featured on many occasions in major concert halls of Ireland, as well as on several broadcasts for RTE television and BBC Songs of Praise, and in 2017 released an album with the New Irish Choir and Orchestra, produced by Jonathan Rea.

Rebekah Durston (Violin) studied at The Royal College of Music and has since performed across the UK and Europe. Now based in Northern Ireland, she has established a thriving private teaching practice, and is both leader and frequent soloist with the New Irish Orchestra. In 2018 Rebekah was awarded the British Empire Medal in the Queen's New Year's Honours for her services to music in Northern Ireland.

Steph Devlin (Soprano) studied music at Durham University, where she was particularly active as a singer and composer. She released a solo worship album in 2016 and continues to be active as a soloist for New Irish Arts in concerts, services, and broadcasts, as well as being involved with the music at her home church.

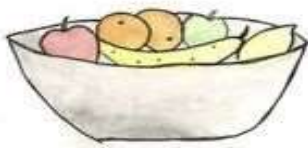

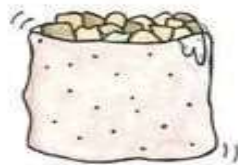
