Congratulations! How wonderful that you are taking this exciting next step! We hope that we can help you as you explore the possibility of having your marriage blessed here on the Costa del Sol.

The Costa del Sol West Chaplaincy is part of the Diocese of Europe and like many other chaplaincies in the diocese we do not own our own church building. We currently use the Roman Catholic churches in San Pedro and Sotogrande to worship each Sunday. They are beautiful buildings and provide a lovely location for your wedding blessing. We can arrange to book these church buildings for you, but wedding blessings can also take place in lots of locations; beaches, restaurants and hotels. Unlike in the UK, it is administratively difficult for us to conduct the legal part of a marriage, so that is normally completed in the UK or in Gibraltar before the blessing.

What is a Wedding Blessing?

The blessing service involves some similar aspects to a wedding service with exchanging vows and declarations. The Wedding Blessing service is a beautiful, spiritual way to further cement the vows taken and ask God's blessing on your life together as a couple. It provides a positive, determined and wonderful start to a lifelong commitment.





- A form will be sent to you when you make your inquiry. This gives us some of the basic information we need and will be used to complete the Blessing Certificate. Please complete the form. Until this is received we cannot make a definite booking. We ask for a €100 deposit for the event. We will send you details about how payments can be made either to the Chaplaincy (in euros) or via the Church of England Diocese in Europe (in sterling).
- You will need to meet the chaplain two or three times. One or two will be to think about the significance of a Christian wedding blessing. The content will also be discussed and there are some useful suggestions following about the service, music and readings. One final meeting will be a practice at the location.
- As you are planning to undertake a Christian marriage you are asked to commit to attending church, either where you live or at the one of the churches we use. In this way not only will you feel more comfortable in the environment, but it will provide support to engage with God before you make your vows before him and ask his blessing. We will be praying for you whether you are with us or not.
- Music is your responsibility though we can put you in touch with organists, guitar players, local choirs and/or solo singers that other wedding blessings have used successfully in the past. We can also play music through our speakers which provides more options, but we must be mindful as the Roman Catholic priest may disallow some types of music in the church. The music will be discussed at the first meeting and if you are using a marriage arranger discuss that also with them.
- There are three orders of service attached. The first is the traditional Church of England marriage service, adapted as a blessing. The second is a Church of England Marriage Blessing service with some Spanish custom additions. The third is for a blessing when the couple have been married in a registry office a long time ago, or who have been partners for many (e.g. 20) years. The choice of service is for us to discuss. You may want to choose readings and music other than hymns. Together we should be able to make changes to suit your wishes. All the services are in modern English, but traditional English can be used instead, if you wish. The last version includes a quality translation into Spanish as this has been used in an English wedding blessing but with many Spanish present.
- There are a number of locations that are most frequently used for marriages. If you are looking for a church wedding blessing then both of the Roman Catholic churches that the Chaplaincy uses can be used for a wedding blessing. The Sotogrande church (seating about 200) does not charge for this but the San Pedro church (seating about 300) does charge. The La Virginia chapel (which is not a Roman Catholic church) in Marbella (seating about 80) is also a beautiful spot. Charges for the venues are usually less than €500 and dependent on the venue owner. The use of other Roman Catholic Churches is dependent on the agreement of the Roman Catholic priest (and/or Bishop).

• If you are a same sex couple, do get in touch so that we can explore possibilities for you within the guidelines of the Church of England, which is currently engaged in discerning how we can better fulfill the church's responsibility of being a place of inclusion for all.



- There are some circumstances where it is not necessarily possible to bless a marriage within a Roman Catholic church, for example if one of those being married is previously divorced having been married in a Roman Catholic ceremony, however we can bless couples where one or both of them has previously been divorced, subject to discussion with the couple about their commitment to the vows they will be making in the light of the previous marriage(s).
- The charges set annually by the Chaplaincy are broadly equivalent to the charges made for a Church of England wedding in the UK. This may be paid in euros or sterling equivalent. Unfortunately we have to insist that the payment is made at or before the wedding practice. Please email the Chaplain for the latest figures.
- If you want to explore undertaking both the legal part of the marriage and the wedding blessing in Spain, both at the same time, as in the UK, you should be aware that this is not impossible, but it is not easy. It does need plenty of prior planning and you will have to research this carefully. There have been many recent changes as a result of Brexit and so we are not able to advise you about this process. If neither of you has been resident in Spain there are more complications and you will definitely need the help of a Spanish lawyer. It is cheaper and easier to marry in Gibraltar, for example, the day before your blessing in Spain. (cost of registry marriage in Gibraltar is about £150). You will also have the certificate in English which may be more use to you in the future. If you do marry in Gibraltar it is mandatory that you spend either the night before or after the marriage residing on the Rock (in a hotel or similar). You will be asked for proof of that.
- You may want to prepare an order of service to go with the event. This is often printed as a booklet. We need to discuss the content of that and you need to send me a draft prior to it being printed. I have provided a simple outline in the pack.

On the following pages you will find some sample service formats. The third is more suited to couples who have been together for many years. There is a translation provided to help

I give you these coins as a token of all that we now share together.

The wife repeats this gesture with the same words]

 $\it N$ and $\it N$ have here affirmed their resolve in the marriage which they have begun. Will you, their families and friends, support and uphold them in their marriage, now and in the years to come?

All: We will

Sharing the cup

[This cup contains the sweet wine of Spain, made from grapes ripened under our cloudless skies. May this marriage be cloudless. May the sweetness of the grapes be with you all your lives.

The husband and wife both drink from the cup and say

Music for this moment might be gentle, dramatic, emotional and touching, but always positive. The type of music you choose may depend on the size of the church and which songs or music really mean something to you both. These are some popular, classic pieces:

Clair de Lune, Debussy Canon in D, Pachelbel Arrival of the Queen of Sheba, from 'Solomon', Handel Trumpet Voluntary, aka the Prince of Denmark's March, Jeremiah Clarke Salut D'Amour, Elgar Bridal Chorus from Lohengrin, Wagner Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring, J S Bach

For signing the certificate

You and your two witnesses will move to a table, (or even go into a separate room), to sign the certificate. Either way, it is a moment of pause in the ceremony and music is often played at this point.

You can choose a hymn for your guests to sing, or have a piece of music played, either by a live musician, or from a CD/MP3 player.

For leaving the ceremony

Music for this part of your ceremony is always upbeat and cheerful. These are some popular, traditional classics, but let's talk if you'd like something different. In some of the Roman Catholic churches, the Roman Catholic priest may disallow some types of music.

Readings from the Bible (there must be at least one)

Some popular/recommended ones:

1 Corinthians 13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

John 2.1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

John 15.9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'

1 John 4.7-12

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

Philippians 4.4-9

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Romans 8.31-35,37-39

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

1 John 3.18-end

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

If I speak with human eloquence and angelic ecstasy but don't love, I'm nothing but the creaking of a rusty gate. If I speak God's Word with power, revealing all his mysteries and making everything plain as day, and if I have faith that says to a mountain, "Jump," and it jumps, but I don't love, I'm nothing. If I give everything I own to the poor and even go to the stake to be burned as a martyr, but I don't love, I've got nowhere. So, no matter what I say, what I

believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love. Love never gives up. Love cares more for others than for self. Love doesn't want what it doesn't have. Love doesn't strut, Doesn't boast, Doesn't force itself on others,

Is not always "me first," Doesn't get angry, Doesn't keep a count of the sins of others, Doesn't revel when others grovel, Takes pleasure in the flowering of truth, Puts up with anything, Trusts God always, Always looks for the best, Never looks back, But keeps going to the end.

Love never dies. Inspired speech will be over some day; praying in tongues will end; understanding will reach its limit. We know only a portion of the truth, and what we say about God is always incomplete. But when the Complete arrives, our incompleteness will be cancelled.

When I was an infant at my mother's breast, I gurgled and cooed like any infant. When I grew up, I left those infant ways for good. We don't yet see things clearly. We're peering through a mist. But it won't be long before the weather clears and the sun shines bright! We'll see it all then, see it all as clearly as God sees us, knowing him directly just as he knows us!

But for now, until that completeness, we have three things to do to lead us toward that end: Trust steadily in God, hope unswervingly, love extravagantly. And the best of the three is love.

Whist these have no legal validity (unlike the marriage certificate in the UK/Gibraltar which is also the civil/legal certificate), this may be useful if you are, for example, hoping to get children into a church school in the UK if the school has more applications than it can normally take, or if you are seeking a renewal of vows in the future, or if one of you is looking for a job in the church.
