TRUE FREEDOM

A NEW GLOBAL COURSE FOR LENT 2024

"The Clewer Initiative, on behalf of the Church of England, has worked with the World Council of Churches to produce a global Lent course to help Christians learn about the challenges of modern slavery and human trafficking. Based upon Paul's letter to the Galatians with its great theme of bondage and freedom, the course offers an opportunity for people to prayerfully consider how best they can make a creative contribution". Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury.

Modern slavery affects people of all ages, ethnicities and social status

Many factors drive modern slavery worldwide:

- * an increasing number of vulnerable people
- * the desire in all of us for cheap goods and services
- * the globalisation of indifference
- * an increasing distance between employers and those who work for them
- * the increasing sophistication of criminal gangs
- * the climate crisis and mass migration

Shrove Tuesday is on 13th February

So courses could start that week or the following week to get six sessions in before Easter Day on 31st March. Let your churchwarden know if you are interested, and what time and day suits you. Also, could you offer to host a session or sessions?

How the course works. Each session consists of the following elements:

- An opening paragraph, sharing the theme of the week and introductory information about modern slavery
- A modern slavery fact file, helping you understand the scale of the issue
- One or two case studies telling the story of a victim of modern slavery some of these have been filmed and can be watched during or after the session
- The bible reading a chapter from Galatians
- A reflection, written by Revd Dr Kenneth Mtata and Bishop Alastair Redfern, drawing on themes from a chapter in the book of Galatians
- A set of questions to encourage discussion and reflection
- An opportunity to look at two contemporary illustrations and consider how they add to your understanding of the theme
- A prayer
- A story of hope
- Some action points

In the meantime, to prepare, why not start reading Galatians now.

1% LEGACIES

It is natural that we struggle to think about our own mortality and eventual death. However, as Christians, we understand that we are made of 'dust and unto dust we shall return', as the blessing of Ash Wednesday reminds us each year.

Preparing for our death is practical as well as spiritual; there are family and friends for whom we might like to make some financial provision, to hand on valued possessions to those whom we love.

Whilst we all make a valuable contribution to the Church during our lives, it is fitting that we should consider making some financial provision for the continuation of its mission after we have gone. 1% is a small amount of your overall estate, but it can make a significant difference to the continuing work of God's Church here.

I commend this 1% legacy scheme to you and ask that you consider making a legacy to help continue the work of the Anglican Chaplaincy of the Costa del Sol West in the future, a place where you may already be involved. If you, for example, have no surviving relatives and have not made a will it is only the state that benefits from what you leave behind.

As you may know, our chaplaincy is totally self-financing and its work is **only** possible because of the generosity of many people – its worshippers and benefactors.

Should you wish to extend your generosity beyond the boundaries of your earthly life and arrange a 1% legacy for the Anglican Chaplaincy of the Costa del Sol West, I suggest that you use the following wording when making or updating a U.K. will:

"I give to the Diocese in Europe whose registered office is situated at 14 Tufton Street, London, SW1P 3QZ, the sum of 1% of my estate to be applied for the mission and extension of the Anglican Chaplaincy of the Costa del Sol (West) in Marbella with Estepona and Algeciras and I declare that a receipt from the Diocesan secretary for the time being of the Diocese in Europe will be sufficient receipt for my executors for the same."

By using the foregoing wording, you should ensure U.K. Inheritance Tax is <u>not</u> applied to your gift.

Likewise, when making or updating a will in Spain, the following wording, translated into Spanish by your lawyer, should be used:

"I give to the Communión Anglicana Costa del Sol (Oeste) en Marbella con Estepona y Algeciras, NIF: R2900260G, Domicilio: Calle Juan de Fuca 27, Urb. Beverly Hills, 29680, Estepona, Málaga and registered with the Federación de Entidades Religiosas Evangelicas de Espana, Numero 016345, the sum of 1% of my estate to be applied for the mission and extension of the Communión Anglicana Costa del Sol (Oeste) en Marbella con Estepona y Algeciras and declare that a receipt from the treasurer for the time being of the Communión Anglicana Costa del Sol Oeste will be sufficient for my executors for the same."

By using the foregoing wording, you should ensure that Spanish Inheritance Tax is <u>not</u> applied to your gift.

Your gift will help future generations to worship and carry out God's mission here in the Anglican Chaplaincy of the Costa del Sol West.


