An Easter message from our Chaplain

Dear All.

As we journey through the weeks of Lent, just a short video to remind you of the various opportunities available to support you in your own pilgrimages towards the Easter celebrations.

The first is the Lent Group which meets on Thursdays and is using St Paul's Letter to the Galatians as a biblical accompaniment for addressing some contemporary issues which we face as a society such as the dehumanizing commerce of human trafficking. Second, in terms of services, we have a Maundy Thursday celebration at Chaplaincy House in Estepona at 12 noon followed by a shared lunch. On Good Friday, we will join with the German Protestant Church here on the Costa del Sol West in the Way of the Cross at the Calvary Church in Marbella.

On Easter Sunday there will be two services to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord. One at San Pedro Church at 10am and one at Sotogrande Church at 12 noon. You are all very welcome to attend.

Third, for those of you who are sick and housebound, please be assured that in your journeys, you are very much in our thoughts and prayers and you can always follow our recorded services online through clicking the link on Pew News or on the chaplaincy website.

Lenten Reflections

God's claim is infinite and inexorable. You can refuse it, or you can begin to try to grant it. There is no middle way. ECO NEWS



1. SWITCH TO SHOWERS

Switching from baths to showers is an easy way to save water. If you're already a shower person, then try keeping your shower to 4 minutes or less.

2. KEEP THE SPRINKLERS OFF

If you have a garden then remember to keep the sprinklers off! There's lots of ways to water your garden without them – invest in a water butt that collects water throughout the year for you to use, or try using cooking water instead. Your plants will benefit from the extra nutrients!

3. TURN OFF THE TAP

Running taps waste as much as 6 litres of water a minute. So remember to turn off the tap when you're brushing your teeth, or try filling a bowl of water when rinsing vegetables or fruit to keep your veg clean and your water usage low!

4. FILL UP THE WASHING UP BOWL

Make sure that you're filling a bowl when doing the washing up. Filling a bowl with water – and cleaning the cleanest items first – means you're unlikely to need to change the water and will save a huge amount of water in comparison to washing everything under the tap.
